Black Bear Country:

Our bear is seen every day and is grateful for trash left outside, but does not clean up afterwards. The Park Service estimates a bear can smell food over 2 miles away, and can run over 30 mph. Our neighborhood is a mile across, so he can get to your trash in 2 minutes. Don't leave trash outside and be sure to engage the dumpster latch pin. The PA Game Commission website states: "Intentionally feeding bears is against the law in Pennsylvania. It is also against the law to put out any feed, for any wildlife, that is causing bears to congregate or habituate to an area."

This is for the minority who do *not*: Dumpsters are for *household trash only* of PFSC residents. No furniture, mattresses, tires, carpets. If you think someone may want your old furniture, sell it on Craigslist or LetGo, or donate it to Salvation Army in Mt. Pocono or Scranton – don't leave it in the rain near the dumpsters! Do not ask a "friend" from outside PFSC to throw away your trash – it looks suspicious, and they may be confronted by residents who don't recognize them.

Keep Looking Up (good for your back too):
Perseid meteor shower; 11-12 Aug (best after midnight), and several nights before and after.
Meteors occur anywhere – one a minute.
